

## ENGLISH HERITAGE GUIDANCE ON ACKNOWLEDGING YOUR GRANT

Acknowledging your grant from English Heritage is a condition of our support.

You must therefore display the relevant temporary adhesive sign during physical works and use an English Heritage Supportive Logo on any publicity or educational material related to the grant aided project.

### How to acknowledge our support

Once physical works are underway you must display the temporary adhesive sign sent to you by your regional office shortly after your grant offer. Two types are issued: a turquoise sign for the Repair Grants for Places of Worship scheme and a grey sign for the Historic Buildings, Monuments and Designed Landscapes scheme. The grey sign may also be used for Partnership Schemes in Conservation Areas grant scheme projects under the guidance of your regional office.

We would expect to see an English Heritage Supportive Logo on any publicity or educational material related to projects funded by our grant schemes, for example press releases, websites and invitations. English Heritage Supportive Logos contain the English Heritage portcullis logo with the words 'Conservation work supported by' above.

**Please note that we need sight of any materials intended to carry our logos before these are finalised.**
