## **Terms and Conditions**

- 5. The competition is open to residents of the United Kingdom over the age of 5. Entrants under the age of 17 will need permission from a parent or guardian (aged 18 or over). One winner will be chosen from each of the following age categories 5-8, 9-12, 13-16, 17+.
- 6. Employees or contractors of English Heritage, any person directly or indirectly involved in English Heritage or the running of the competition, or their direct family members are not eligible for the prize.
- 7. There is no entry fee and no purchase necessary to enter this Competition.
- 8. By entering this Competition, an entrant is indicating their agreement to be bound by these terms and conditions.
- 9. To enter the Competition entrants must fill in an entry sheet which can be downloaded from the English Heritage website. This must be emailed to us with the age category the entrant wishes to enter stated clearly in the subject of the email. Entries must be sent as a Word document, image (JPEG or PNG) or as a PDF.
