Access information

Facilities:

- On-site parking is reserved for Blue Badge holders and visitors with access needs
- There are 5 accessible toilets and 1 Changing Place facility
- Baby Changing is available in all accessible toilets

Getting around:

- Mobility Scooters and manual wheelchairs available to borrow from the Visitor Centre on first come, first served basis
- Wheelchair accessible bus regularly circulates around the site. Drop off/pick up is at the locations marked on the map roughly every 15 minutes
- You can take a number of different routes around the site. The most convenient step-free route from the Visitor Centre to the events arena is shown on the map
- All shops, cafes and restaurants are step-free

Sensory information:

- There will be loud noises throughout the day as part of the battlefield performances in the events arena and there will be an air raid siren sounding 11:45 and 14:45. The areas inside the castle walls will be much quieter. Ear defenders are available on a first come, first served basis from the Information Tent. Staff will be handing out ear plugs at show times
