


# Pendennis Castle to St Mawes Castle Cornwall

## Need to know

- **OS reference:** OS Explorer map 105
- **Distance:** 5 miles/8km, including 3 miles/4.8km ferry trip (1 hour walking plus time for the ferry and to look at the castles)
- **Difficulty:** 1/5
- **Terrain:** urban streets
- **Opening times:** Pendennis Castle – 10am-6pm Monday-Sunday | April-30 September; 10am-5pm Monday-Sunday | October-3 November; 10am-4pm 4 November-31 December (closed 23-25 December)  
St Mawes Castle – 10am-6pm Monday-Sunday | April-30 September; 10am-5pm Monday-Sunday | October-3 November; Saturdays and Sundays only 10am-4pm 4 November-29 December; 10am-4pm 30 and 31 December
- **Access:** suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs
- **Dog walkers:** suitable for dog walkers
- **Refreshments:** café at Pendennis Castle; vending machine at St Mawes Castle
- **Grid reference:** starts at Pendennis Castle (SW824317) and ends at St Mawes Castle (SW840327)
- **Sat nav:** starts at Pendennis Castle, TR11 4LP and ends at St Mawes Castle, TR2 5DE

## Directions

- 1 From Pendennis Castle, walk through the town of Falmouth towards the Custom House Quay.
- 2 Take the St Mawes ferry to St Mawes. The journey lasts around 20 minutes.
- 3 Once at St Mawes Pier and Harbour, walk towards the main road and turn left onto Lower Castle Road/A3078. Follow this road for half a mile.
- 4 Turn left onto Castle Drive and St Mawes Castle will be ahead.
