

the movement of something from its usual place.

stories that describe imaginary people and events.

Nonfiction

writings that contain accurate, factual information.

Rancid

disgusting or offensive.

Species

a kind, sort or variety of plant or animal e.g. mammal, reptile, bird.

Specimen

a sample used for a test or experiment.

Tentacle




a sticky, hairy limb which sticks out from the leaf of an insect-eating plant.

Wedgwood


a fine china company founded on 1 May 1759 by Josiah Wedgwood, Emma and Charles's grandfather.
