Learning objectives

WHAT: develop an understanding of the strategic location of Pendennis Castle; learn about the lives of the people who lived here in the past; appreciate how we know about the past through surviving artefacts.

HOW: through interactive exploration of the site and handling replica items.

OUTCOME: students understand how and why international events influenced the location and building of Pendennis Castle. They are able to articulate differences between life in the Tudor era and their lives today.

Duration

1 hour 15 minutes

NOW AND THEN

This hands-on guided session uses costumes and handling artefacts to help your class consider who might have lived and worked at Pendennis Castle in Tudor times and to look at the similarities and differences with our lives today.

PRIOR LEARNING

We recommend you do the following before the Discovery Visit:

- Explore the location of Pendennis Castle on a map so that students have an understanding of its position on the coastline.
- Develop students' chronological understanding and remind students where the Tudor period features on a timeline.

Learning objectives

WHAT: understand the strategic position of Pendennis Castle and St Mawes Castle and their role as artillery forts; learn about the conditions for people living at Pendennis and how the castle reflects the changing nature of warfare.

HOW: observing and exploring the surrounding landscape and key locations at the castle; using role-play to re-imagine the lives of the people who lived and worked at Pendennis and episodes in the castle's history.

OUTCOME: summarise why Pendennis is a significant local landmark; identify how the castle responded to changing warfare from the Tudor period to the Second World War; demonstrate empathy for the people living at the castle.

Duration

1 hour 30 minutes

DISCOVERY VISIT SUMMARY

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ENEMIES ON THE HORIZON

This interactive guided tour explores the importance of Pendennis Castle in defending Cornwall from foreign attack over the past 400 years. Your class will explore the site and use role-play to consider how defences and weaponry have developed over time and what life was like for those working here, from a Tudor gunner in Henry VIII's Gun Tower to a Second World War officer in the Battery Observation Post.

PRIOR LEARNING

We recommend you do the following before the Discovery Visit:

- Explore the location of Pendennis Castle and St Mawes Castle on the coastline and their proximity to Spain and France
- Develop students' chronological understanding and remind students where the Tudor, Elizabethan and Second World War periods feature on a timeline.

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
